NEW: Proposed Rule Changes for Child Care Programs in 2004

Two state laws were passed in 2003 that impact child care centers and homes. House Bill 152 requires child care facilities that care for infants to place infants on their backs to sleep, to develop policies on safe sleep environments, and for infant caregivers to complete training on safe sleep practices. Senate Bill 226 makes it illegal to give medication to children in child care without proper authorization.

The Child Care Commission proposes some changes to the child care licensing rules to implement these laws, along with some other revisions. If adopted, the changes would become effective May 1, 2004. Anyone is welcome to comment on the proposed rules, either in writing or verbally at a public hearing. The Child Care Commission is interested in hearing your suggested changes, concerns, or support for the proposed rules
